The army regular has been selected by the Singapore Shooti (SSA) for a year-long training stint at the United States Olyn Center in Colorado Springs.

The programme is part of a tie-up between the Singapore Sp and the US Olympic Committee.

On, 29, will be the third Singapore shooter to train full-time, specialist Lee Wung Yew and air-rifle specialist Vanessa Yong

The SSA's high performance manager, Lim Meng Kiaw, said: eventually, he can make it to the Olympics. Maybe not for 20 for 2012.
