

S'pore's silver Saturday

Schoolgirls bang on target in 10m air rifle, despite the distraction of books

FOR the past month, sisters Jasmine and Adrienne Ser plus Vanessa Yong have been spending more time in the examination halls than on the shooting range. But, at the Lusail Shooting Range yesterday, they passed their Asian Games test with flying colours.

The trio won Singapore's first Doha Asiad medal: a silver in the women's 10m air rifle team event.

They combined for 1,183 points, behind winners China (1,192). India (1,181) took the bronze.

The silver is worth \$200,000 under Singapore's Multi-Million Award Programme – about \$67,000 each.

An hour after receiving her medal, Jasmine, who completed her O levels on Nov 16, was still in a state of disbelief

Said the 16-year-old Ahmad Ibrahim Secondary stusalu the 16-year-old Ahmad Ibrahim Secondary student: "This is beyond my wildest dream. We never expected a silver. There are China, India, Japan here. I thought the best we could hope for was a bronze."

She shot a 396, while teammates Vanessa and Adrience got 394 and 393 respectively.

Added Vanessa: "We had to go full-steam ahead after exams. It was more intensive. But I enjoy shooting more than studying. So no complaints."
