Petacchi wins to take overall lead

VALDOBBIADENE (Italy): Alessandro Petacchi won his second straight stage in the Giro d'Italia on Monday to take the overall lead.

The Italian beat Tyler Farrar of the United States and Francesco Gavazzi of Italy in a sprint finish to end the third leg, taking the pink jersey from Briton Mark Cavendish.

A crash in the final kilometres divided the main pack, and Cavendish was caught behind, finishing 1min 25sec after the leaders.

There was some controversy over whether Petacchi's LPR Team should have waited for Cavendish to catch up so he could contest the sprint also, out of respect for the pink jersey.

"I just found out now that he crashed," Petacchi said.

Two American riders with the Garmin-Slipstream squad – Christian Vande Velde and David Zabriskie – fell on a downhill section at the 140-km mark. Zabriskie got back on his bike, but Vande Velde was taken to hospital with two broken ribs.

Lance Armstrong, who is competing in his first Giro, finished in the main pack. He crossed 50th with the same time as Petacchi, moving the seven-time Tour de France winner up from 10th to fifth overall, 31 seconds behind Petacchi.

"I just tried to stay out of trouble again," said Armstrong, who suggested that cycling officials may have to rethink how they set up races with bikes going faster now.

"In less than a second, your career can change - your life can change. I've seen somebody die. I've seen somebody lose a career and I've seen somebody lose a season."

Ronaldo may face his Utd successor

LONDON: Cristiano Ronaldo could come face to face tonight with the man who has been earmarked to replace him at Manchester United.

Speculation is rife that a ± 20 million (S\$44.5 million) deal has already been agreed for Wigan's Antonio Valencia should Ronaldo fulfil his Real Madrid ambitions at the end of the season.

But the mouth-watering head-to-head between the two wingers may be scuppered if manager Alex Ferguson leaves the World Player of the Year out for his petulant reaction to being substituted against Manchester City last Sunday. Ferguson may want to rest him for the much tougher tie against Arsenal on Saturday.

Victory against a Wigan side with just one point from their last five matches would leave United needing only to avoid defeat against the Gunners to lift the trophy with a game still to play.

Ferguson, though, is aiming to finish the season with three more victories.

"He tells us we need to win every game," United defender Patrice Evra said. "In March, we lost to Liverpool and Fulham and that was the first time since I arrived that we'd lost two League games in a row. I've never felt pain like that before and I don't want to again."

United have played Wigan eight times since the end of 2005 and won every time - by an aggregate score of 24-3. On their last visit to the JJB Stadium, United left with the League trophy after a 2-0 win clinched the title on last season's final day.

Still, Wigan midfielder Olivier Kapo remains optimistic.

"United are top of the League, but to me the best team is Liverpool. They play the most beautiful attacking football," he said. "I cannot wait to play United. As long as they do not make life hell for us, we will be fine."

Wigan will be without Egypt striker Amr Zaki because of a knee injury while former England goalkeeper Chris Kirkland is also struggling with a back injury, with Richard Kingson on standby.

The Ghana international is determined to prove himself, after being axed by Birmingham last season and branded "a complete waste of space" by club owner David Sullivan.

Ferguson, meanwhile, will give late fitness tests to centre-backs Rio Ferdinand, who missed the derby match with a calf strain, and Jonny Evans, who limped out of the win over City with a hamstring problem.

John O'Shea will play in central defence if both are ruled out. Paul Scholes, Michael Carrick and Wayne Rooney are among those set to return.

He is keen on Ronaldo but sees AC Milan's Kaka as a cheaper option that will free up cash for other targets, reported The Daily Mail. Still, the entire Ronaldo saga has left some Real players unhappy.
